# Our trips this half-term

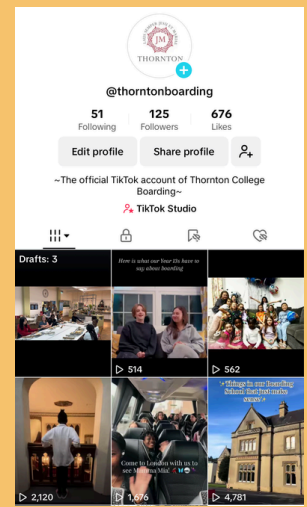


# OUR SOCIAL MEDIA

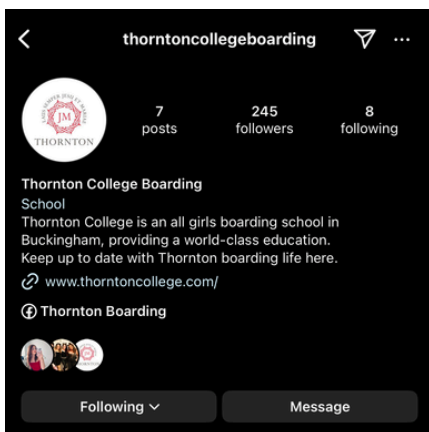
